## Contraindications

- Under the age of 18
- You are a smoker (pigment may not retain properly, colors may distort).
- If you have a history of MRSA
- Allergies to makeup or colors.
- You have psoriasis in the treatment area.
- You have an auto-immune disease.
- You have thyroid/graves disease (medication may cause pigment to not retain properly)
- Transmittable diseases such as HIV or Hepatitis.
- Individuals prone to hyperpigmentation. Consult will determine if you are a good candidate.
- Eye lift or blepharoplasty: Wait about 3 months
- Active shingles
- Uncontrolled high blood pressure or mitral valve disorder
- Skin diseases such as psoriasis, eczema and undiagnosed rashes or blisters on the site that is to be treated
- Hemophiliac or if on Blood thinners (consult with your physician)
- You have anemia (pigment may not retain properly).
- You have a history of keloid or hypertrophic scarring.
- You are currently undergoing chemotherapy.
- You are pregnant or nursing. (You cannot have this service. No exceptions.)
- You have Diabetes type 1 or 2 (due to slow healing and infection, color may or may not retain well).
- If you are under a doctor's care and have questions at ALL about being able to have this procedure, it is your responsibility to meet with your doctor and get written approval.

\*\*\* Please note that even if none of the above apply, eyebrow tattooing cannot be guaranteed. This is a cosmetic tattooing procedure, the skin can be unpredictable, it is up to your skin to retain the pigment. Generally, results are successful, however, due to skin type, healing or bleeding during procedure, some results can differ\*\*
